Concert Singers Symphonic Choir with orchestra

Amy Beach (1867-1944) was the first highly successful American female composer of large-scale art music and a critical figure in the history of American music. Her *Canticle of the Sun*, a 23-minute work for choir and large orchestra, was premiered in 1928 and has only rarely been performed since. Written late in her career, it shows a side of Beach that is less familiar to audiences than some of her earlier music. Our presentation could very well be the first North Carolina performance of this unique musical work. Lauridsen's *Lux Aeterna* is a modern classic. Composed in 1997, beloved by choirs, it has become a staple of American choral repertoire.
